## ALLOCATION OF SEATS ON COMMITTEES

## 1 SUMMARY

1.1 The Council is invited to agree the allocation of seats to Committees following a by election for the vacant seat in Sweyne Park and Grange ward.

2 DISCUSSION
2.1 The Council has a statutory duty by virtue of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 to ensure that appointments to Committees reflect the proportion of the total number of seats on the Council held by each political group, unless otherwise agreed.
2.2 Following a recent change in the political composition as a result of the by election held on 26 September 2019, the Assistant Director, Legal and Democratic has re-calculated the allocation of seats in accordance with the Act, which sets down the following criteria that must be followed when appointing Members to Committees:-
(1) That not all the seats are held by Members of the same political group.
(2) That, if a political group has a majority of the membership of the Council, then that group has the majority of the seats.
(3) That, subject to principles (1) and (2) above, the total number of seats each political group has on all ordinary Committees is in proportion to that group's share of the total Council elected membership.
(4) That, subject to principles (1), (2) and (3) above, each political group has the same proportion of seats as it holds on the Council as a whole.
2.3 The current composition of the Council is as follows:-

Conservative 27
Green 3
Liberal Democrat 3
Rochford District Residents 3
Non Group Members 3
2.4 The proposed allocation of seats to Committees and the Council's one SubCommittee, the Planning Policy Sub-Committee, is as indicated in appendix 1 to this report. For ease of reference, Appendix 2 sets out the allocation of seats agreed at Annual Council on 14 May 2019 and Appendix 3 sets out the current membership of Committees/Sub-Committees.

## 3 LICENSING \& APPEALS COMMITTEE

3.1 The Licensing and Appeals Committee has recently been operating with five vacant seats. These were seats allocated to the Green (1), Liberal Democrat
(1) and Rochford District Residents (3) Groups at Annual Council on 14 May 2019. This has created practical difficulties for officers in organising hearings to determine licensing applications or appeals which can be required at short notice depending on the nature of the objection or reason for review, i.e public safety and safeguarding.
3.2 When there is a need to hold a licensing hearing, officers telephone Members of the Committee avoiding, where necessary, Members whose ward a licensed premises falls within. Officers look back at the last hearings held and do not contact Members who have participated in recent hearings, unless they are not able to make contact with sufficient other Members to form a SubCommittee. Officers make every effort to contact in the first instance those Members who have not recently participated in a licensing hearing; however, if a Member does not answer the telephone or call officers back promptly, another Member is contacted.
3.3 The Green, Liberal Democrat and Rochford District Residents Groups have, since Annual Council, confirmed to officers that they do not wish to appoint to this particular Committee.~
3.4 Regulation 15 of the Local Government (Committees and Political Groups) Regulations 1990 states: 'Where a political group has failed to express its wishes in relation to the appointment to such a seat as is mentioned in regulation 14 within the period of three weeks beginning with the date on which notice was given under that regulation, the authority or committee may make such appointment to that seat as they think fit.'
3.5 Council can therefore decide to allocate any seats on the Licensing and Appeals Committee that remain unallocated three weeks after the date of this Council meeting to either Members of the Conservative Group or to Non Group Members. A meeting of the Licensing \& Appeals Committee would be convened, if necessary, within three weeks of this Council meeting in order to appoint to any vacant seats on the Committee.

## 4 RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS
