# LIGHTING IN ALLEYWAYS

### 1 SUMMARY

1.1 This report advises Members of the alleyways that are owned / managed by the Council and considered suitable for lighting improvement to increase the feeling of public safety.

#### 2 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 Members included a sum of £5,000 in the 2006/07 Revenue Budget for lighting improvements to alleyways owned by Rochford District Council.
- 2.2 This report does not consider alleyways that may be subject to transfer to the Rochford Housing Association.
- 2.3 Officers have twice included items in the Members' Bulletin requesting Members to bring forward any suggested locations for this initiative.

## 3 IDENTIFIED LOCATIONS

- 3.1 The following potential locations are areas owned by Rochford District Council (RDC) that have been identified by officers and Members, but only two actually need any improvement at this stage:-
  - High Street to Websters Way, Rayleigh.
  - Websters Way car park to Eastwood Road.
  - Castle Road car park to Eastwood Road, Rayleigh part only lighting in RDC section (1 column).
  - Southend Road car park to Southend Road, Hockley Member suggestion.
  - Bradley Way to Back Lane, Rochford.
- 3.2 Other locations will need to be identified for potential future schemes.

#### **Priorities**

- 3.2 In order to prioritise the identified locations, the following information has been taken into account. Plans for the locations are provided at Appendix A.
  - Bradley Way to Back Lane in poor condition high priority.
  - Southend Road car park to Southend Road needs improving high priority.
  - Castle Road car park to Eastwood Road RDC section lit low priority.

- Websters Way to Eastwood Road well lit no work required.
- High Street to Websters Way new lighting and CCTV no work required.
- 3.3 It is considered that the two high priority schemes should be implemented in 2006/07 £2000 at Hockley car Park and £3000 at Bradley Way to Back Lane.

## 4 **RISK IMPLICATIONS**

4.1 Failing to light these vulnerable areas may be a reputational risk to the Council and safety risk to the public.

## 5 CRIME AND DISORDER IMPLICATIONS

5.1 Lighting improvements provide significant benefits to public safety and the perception of safety.

## 6 ENVIRONMENTAL IMPLICATIONS

6.1 Lighting improvements encourage people to keep the environment clean and safe.

### 7 RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

- 7.1 Finance for the two schemes is included in the2006/07 Revenue Budget.
- 7.2 There will be a need to provide a small revenue support for the ongoing maintenance and energy costs.
- 7.3 Members may wish to consider whether to include a budget bid for 2007/08, to enable further alleyway lighting improvements, but bearing in mind the others identified above are not considered a high priority.

#### 8 **RECOMMENDATION**

8.1 It is proposed that the Committee **RESOLVES** 

That the lighting improvement to the locations suggested in paragraph 3.3 of the report be agreed.




