Chairman and Overview &amp; Scrutiny officer attended a meeting at Hockley Station regarding the graffiti on the station bridge and station canopy.</li> <li>2. Contacted Mark Hughes and Dan Carlin inviting to attend the next Review Committee meeting to provide their input to the Review.</li> </ol>	
<b>Actions still in progress:</b>

Due to holiday commitments Mark Hughes has been unable to attend the September meeting and arrangements are being made for him or a colleague to attend the October meeting of the Committee.</li> <li>2. Following the meeting of the Review Committee on the 18 July introductions have been made to enable 2 Members of the Review Committee to accompany members of their Neighbourhood Police Team.</li> </ol>

<b>Information/observations from Project to be shared since previous document produced:</b>	
<p>Following the recommendations at the previous meeting a meeting was held between the representatives of the CCTV user in the District and the Police. It was agreed that without 24 hour monitoring of the CCTV system overt cameras did not provide a cost effective method of crime detection.</p> <p>The Police have 40 covert cameras available for deployment in the S E Division which covers Southend, Rochford District and Castlepoint and confirmed their willingness to use them whenever necessary.</p> <p>The graffiti at Hockley Station, which has been an ongoing problem for a number of months, has finally been cleared following a meeting on the 17 August. Cllr K H Hudson, Mark Francois and representatives from Network Rail, One Railway, Hockley Parish Council, Essex County Council, Rochford District Council and the Police were able to resolve the existing issues and agree a protocol to deal with any future incidents should they occur.</p>
