TIMETABLE OF MEETINGS 2000/01

1 SUMMARY

1.1. This report recommends the adoption of a timetable of meetings for the 2000/01 municipal year. The Council is required by law to agree the dates of its meetings each year.

2 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 Last year, the Committee asked the Head of Administrative and Member Services to look afresh at the structure of the meetings timetable for the forthcoming year. Members were concerned that the timetable had become disjointed with little time available between meetings to attend to constituency duties or to discuss the content of agenda with colleagues. Problems have also been encountered arranging meetings of ad hoc Sub-Committees at an appropriate point in the cycle of meetings so that they can report to their respective parent committees.
- 2.2 Appendix A to this report is an alternative timetable for the 2000/01 municipal year. A timetable based on the arrangements in the current year is given at Appendix B,for comparative purposes. (Appendices to follow)

3 A NEW TIMETABLE

3.1 The timetable at Appendix A seeks to group meetings of sub-committees and committees in a manner that allows sufficient time

for members to discuss issues that are to be referred up from a sub-committee to a parent committee and from Finance and General Purposes Committee to full Council

for officers to obtain additional information for consideration by the parent committee where this is requested by a subcommittee

for minutes of meetings to be prepared and circulated in good time for the meeting of a parent committee

By leaving gaps in the timetable as proposed, it is possible to slot in meetings of sub-committees that meet on an ad hoc basis at the correct point for them to report into their parent committee. The gaps also provide periods of time for Members to undertake their constituency duties.

3.2 Members will be aware that the Corporate Resources Committee at its meeting on 28 March considered the provision of a comprehensive

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programme of member training in the two weeks immediately following the Annual Council meeting. To accommodate this training, it is proposed to reduce the number of committee cycles from 6 to 5 with only one cycle taking place in the summer. Traditionally, the summer meetings have less business to determine than at other times of the year and it is not anticipated that the reduction of committee cycles will delay the decision making process.

- 3.3 The provision of Member training immediately following the Annual Council meeting does require the meeting of the Planning Services Committee previously scheduled for 25 May to be put back one week to 1 June.
- 3.4 Meetings of the Structural and Procedural Working Party have also been scheduled for the first time to reflect the anticipated workload arising from the Government's modernising agenda.

4 ENVIRONMENTAL IMPLICATIONS

4.1 The reduction from 6 to 5 cycles of meetings will result in fewer meetings to which Members and Officers will have to travel. There will also be a slight reduction in the amount of paper used in the preparation of agenda.

5 RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

5.1 The proposed reduction in the number of meetings held would result in savings in the allowances paid to Members and Officers as well as a reduction in overtime payments for those Officers that qualify.

6 LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

6.1 The Council is free to determine its own timetable of meetings.

7 PARISH IMPLICATIONS

7.1 The proposed timetable continues to avoid Monday evenings when most of the Town and Parish Councils within the Rochford district hold their meetings.

8 **RECOMMENDATION**

8.1 It is proposed that the Committee **RECOMMENDS** the Council to adopt the timetable of meetings for 2000/01 as set out in Appendix A to this report. (HAMS)
