SUMMARY OF DANIEL CARLIN ACTIVITIES RELATING TO ANTI SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

- 1.1 Daniel Carlin is the Road Safety Officer, covering Rochford and Maldon Districts for Essex County Council.
- 1.2 The information below seeks to introduce members to his activities and involvement with regard to Anti Social Behaviour in the District:-
- 1.3 **Roadrunner** This is an annual event and is designed for students from year 10, 11 and 12 the majority of which will be road users in the near future. This is the 5th year that it has been held and this years event will take place between the 11 and 21 September at Belchamps Scout Centre in Hawkwell. It is open to Secondary Schools from the Rochford, Southend and for the first time this year Castlepoint areas. Each area is allocated 3 days and approximately 140 students will visit the site each day and in total they will reach 1,260 students who are soon to be on the roads.
- 1.4 The students will be subject to 8 scenarios of 40 minutes duration over the day.
- 1.5 During the lunch period Essex Fire brigade will present a workshop to the whole group covering Accidents the horror story, equipment used, ripple effect on others, overcrowding in vehicles and seat belts. This will include an extraction demonstration.
- 1.6 The other workshop providers concentrate on driving and the possible problems related to it dealing with their area of expertise. They are:-

Examples of this are the recent meeting held at Clements Hall to engage the young moped riders who were causing a problem in the area, and the public meeting due to be held in Rayleigh to find a way forward with regard to the young bikers in the Bull Lane area.
- 1.9 **Secondary School visits** These are arranged throughout the year to coincide with Industry Days, Workshops and Presentations to deal with Road Safety issues with the students.
