APPLICATION FOR WAIVER OF PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE FEES - BARN DANCE, NEW HALL FARM, LAMBOURNE HALL ROAD, CANEWDON.

1 SUMMARY

- 1.1. This report invites Members to determine an application for the waiver of Public Entertainment Licence fees relating to a barn dance being organised by Canewdon Community Association. The event is due to take place on Saturday 10th June 2000 at New Hall Farm, Lambourne Hall Road, Canewdon.
- 1.2 Indoor entertainments consisting of public dancing and/or music require a Public Entertainment Licence, issued by the Local Authority [Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982, Schedule 1].
- 1.3 The above Act also gives the Local Authority discretion to waive all or part of the fee that would be payable for the grant of a Public Entertainment Licence where it is satisfied that the entertainment is:
 - a) of an educational or other like character or
 - b) is given for a charitable or other like purpose;

2 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 Members previously decided "that in view of the small number involved, all applications for fee waivers be considered on their merits, on the basis that a decision making time frame of at least three months is available to the Council" (Minute 111/97).
- 2.2 An application for a waiver of Public Entertainment Licence fees, dated 10th February 2000, has been received from Mrs S.Webster, Chairman, Canewdon Community.Association (see Appendix A).
- 2.3 The Community Association applied for a fee waiver for a barn dance held at the same venue, in May 1999. Members granted a waiver of 80% of the fees due (Minute 135/99).

3 FEE WAIVER APPLICATION

- 3.1 The application states that the objective of the barn dance is to raise funds for the Community Association.
- 3.2 The Community Association is a Registered Charity (No.1076685).

CORPORATE RESOURCES SUB-COMMITTEE - Item 12 28 March 2000

- 3.3 The Community Association states that funds raised from the barn dance will be used for the upkeep and maintenance of the Village Hall.
- 3.4 The application procedure requires applicants to submit a statement of their latest audited accounts. A copy of the audited accounts for the year ending 31st March 1999 is attached at Appendix B.
- 3.5 The application states that the Community Association is not currently grant funded by Rochford District Council.

4 RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

4.1 Loss of £403.50 income if a 100% fee waiver is granted.

5 PARISH IMPLICATIONS

5.1 The event is being organised to provide entertainment for the local community and to raise funds for the upkeep and maintenance of the village hall.

6 RECOMMENDATION

6.1 It is proposed that the Sub-Committee **RECOMMENDS**:

The fee due if a Public Entertainment Licence is granted. (HHHCC)
