# ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR ORDER PROTOCOL

## 1 SUMMARY

1.1 To apprise Members of the Anti-Social Behaviour Order Protocol (Appendix 1) as collated by Castle Point Borough Council and now awaiting finalisation.

# 2 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 At Community Services Committee 2<sup>nd</sup> October, it was agreed to accept the principles outlined in that report for addressing the implementation of Anti-Social Behaviour Orders and that following consultations a final version of the protocols would be presented to the Community Safety Sub Committee in the new year.
- 2.2 Anti-Social Behaviour procedures can be initiated by a 'relevant authority', that is, either the council for the local government area or any chief officer of police, any part of whose police area lies within that area. Neither relevant authority may make an application for an anti-social behaviour order without consulting the other. Their objective is to curb the behaviour of individuals likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress to others.

#### 3 FURTHER DETAIL

- 3.1 On 26 September 2000 Members of the Community Safety Sub-Committee were apprised of the protocol being developed to address the implementation of anti-social behaviour orders.
- 3.2 It was agreed by the Council that following further consultations, a final version of the protocol be presented to the Sub-Committee in the New Year.

#### 4 CRIME AND DISORDER IMPLICATIONS

4.1 There are many actions within the Crime and Disorder Strategy affected by anti-social behaviour.

#### 5 **RECOMMENDATION**

5.1 It is proposed that the Sub-Committee **RECOMMENDS** 

That the Council accepts the principles in the protocol and that a final version of the protocol be submitted to Partnership Organisations. (CPM)
