SUMMER HOLIDAY ACTIVITIES (Min 390/00)

1 SUMMARY

1.1 The purpose of this report is to apprise Members of this year's summer holiday playschemes.

2 INTRODUCTION

2.1 A wide range of activities were held for children and young people during the school summer holidays. For the second year, activities were provided in partnership with two of the Parish Councils.

3 SWIMMING

- 3.1 This was the third year the swimming scheme operated. A total of six schools were used. Due to the use of Doggetts Primary School being free of charge, extra sessions were provided elsewhere in the District.
- 3.2 Unlike previous years, all of the sessions took place this year. In previous years, the scheme had been hit by poor water quality or problems with pool plant.
- 3.3 All of the venues were popular with an increase of 543 attendances on last year. A breakdown for each venue is detailed below.

3.4 In line with Best Value, customer feedback forms were issued to all of those taking part and the comments received are appended.

4 DAY CAMPS

4.1 The Summer Day Camps were provided by Leisure Connection Plc on behalf of the Council. There were a total of 3,755 attendances catered for out of a possible total of 4,000.

5 SPORTS DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES

- 5.1 This year, a slightly different range of activities were provided for children and young people in the District. The activities on offer comprised netball, cricket, cycling, and basketball. For the 11 15 year old age range, two trips to Grangewaters Outdoor Activity Centre were arranged offering windsurfing, abseiling and mountain biking on rough terrain.
- 5.2 Again this year, Hullbridge and Canewdon Parish Councils contributed towards the cost of providing activities in their villages. Both areas were provided with sports afternoons and Hullbridge also had art and craft sessions.
- 5.3 In total there were a total of 490 attendances.

6 FUTURE PROVISION

- 6.1 This year there was a reduction of 10 attendances for the sports development activities. However, the choice of activities available catered for a wider age range. Overall, of those activities directly provided by the Council, including swimming, the total attendance figure was 3,896 with the previous two years being 3,327 for 2000/2001 and 2,052 for 1999/2000.
- 6.2 The response to some of the activities continues to be disappointing while the success of others continues to grow. This year, the planned rugby and scuba diving were cancelled due to lack of interest.
- 6.3 Talks will continue with schools and young people in the District to ensure that the activities offered meet expectations.

7 CRIME AND DISORDER IMPLICATIONS

7.1 It would appear that the provision of sport and leisure activities for young people contributes towards the reduction of youth crime and youth nuisance. Certainly, the feedback from Hullbridge has been very positive with instances of youth nuisance and crime dropping significantly. This is being attributed to the success of the holiday activity programme.

8 RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

- 8.1 This year, £10,000 was allocated towards the swimming programme and £8,600 towards the day camps run by Leisure Connection Plc. The sports development budget funded the remainder of the sports activities.
- 8.2 The cost of hiring the school pools for the swimming programme has increased and there is also a greater demand for this provision. Therefore for the financial year 2002/03 a sum of £12,000 will be included within the draft estimates for swimming and an inflation increase for the day camps.

9 PARISH IMPLICATIONS

9.1 Hullbridge and Canewdon Parish Councils were partners in the delivery of some of the activities.

10 RECOMMENDATION

- 10.1 It is proposed that the Sub-Committee **RECOMMENDS**
