- (2) That, subject to there being no negative feedback which causes a major redesign from the consultation exercise, the scheme be tendered with a view to commencing on site in spring 2006. (CD(F&ES))

Environmental Issues – the Way Forward (Minute 274/05)

- (1) That the proposed campaign of action to improve the environment be endorsed.
- (2) That a letter be sent to the Local Government Association with respect to lobbying chewing gum manufacturers to pay a levy on chewing gum to help fund the costs of removing chewing gum from pavements. (CD(F&ES))
