All Grants that scored a mean (average) score of more than 6 have passed the funding requirements.

This totals funding of £9,750 awarded out of the £10,000 available for 2021-22. In order to get the maximum value for the grant monies this year at the discretion of the portfolio holder, Cllr Webb, Ashingdon and East Hawkwell Memorial Hall were awarded £250 towards their project as it is felt that they can positively influence their local communities resilience through opening a safe hall for residents use. This takes the total spend to the maximum £10000 available.
