Unless there is a compelling case to demonstrate the absolute need to routinely provide this data, I do not propose to extend the scope of the data we already routinely provide. In relation to road traffic collisions (RTCs) that are not recorded, Essex Police does not record RTCs that meet certain limited criteria. This would include circumstances where there are no injuries and details of drivers are exchanged in accordance with Section 170 Road Traffic Act 1988 and that there is no evidence of unacceptable driver behaviour, or if the RTC is attributable to a minor error of judgment or a momentary lapse of concentration.
