THAMES GATEWAY SOUTH ESSEX – COMMUNITY AND HEALTH PROJECT PROPOSALS

1 SUMMARY

1.1 This report identifies potential Community and Health projects for Rochford District. The projects are indicative in nature and have not been worked up. They aim to give a flavour of what could be achieved in the area should funding be available, for example through East of England Development Agency (EEDA)

2 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 The Thames Gateway South Essex Framework document is being developed and requires input in terms of community development and health. To ensure the area is represented in terms of potential projects officers of the District Council and Castle Point and Rochford Primary Care Trust (PCT) were asked to 'brainstorm' some ideas which could be put forward, as indications of what could be achieved in the area should funding be available.
- 2.2 Each authority and PCT have undertaken a similar process. Thames Gateway South Essex will review the themes identified and include them in the framework document.

3 COMMUNITY AND HEALTH PROJECTS

- 3.1 The projects identified in Appendix 1, are based on themes identified by Thames Gateway South Essex, and are similar in nature to others proposed by authorities in the partnership.
- 3.2 The themes cover
 - Crime and Community Safety
 - Health, Healthy Living and Health care provision
 - Education
 - Voluntary and community sectors, capacity building, community development and equal opportunities
 - Neighbourhood Renewal and Housing Management
 - Arts, Sports and Culture

- 3.3 The projects proposed are based on work currently in development together with some more creative ideas linked to the corporate objectives of the Council.
- 3.4 The Council is not bound by any of the ideas on the list.

- 5.1 Each of the projects identified would have resource implications should they be progressed, at this stage there are no further resource implications.
