#### 1 SUMMARY

1.1 The monitoring of the Stambridge Sewage Treatment Works site is a discretionary service for this Council as the Agency is the enforcement body. However, the Council does have Statutory Nuisance Powers.

2.1 At a meeting of The Stambridge Sewage Treatment Works Working Party on 14 March 2000, Members considered an invitation by the Stambridge Sewage Treatment Works Liaison Committee for three Members of the District Council to attend future meetings. This was resolved at the meeting of Transportation & Environmental Services Committee on 21 March 2000.
