APPOINTMENT OF REPRESENTATIVES TO OUTSIDE BODIES 2006/07

1 SUMMARY

1.1 Members are invited to appoint representatives to serve on outside bodies for the 2006/07 Municipal Year and to endorse attendance at the County Council's South Essex Area Forum, the Rochford Local Strategic Partnership, the Thames Gateway South Essex Board and the Fourth Option Special Interest Group.

2 POLICY

- 2.1 Current Council policy relating to outside bodies includes the following:-
 - Officer appointments to specific seats.
 - Wherever possible, appointments to be from the membership of an appropriate Committee.
 - All appointees to have a substitute and to receive initial briefings on the work of the body by an appropriate officer or a body representative.
 - Member and officer appointees to be asked to report back on the work of bodies to which they are appointed via the Members' Bulletin twice per year. The possibility of an appointee reporting into a Committee should not be discounted as an alternative in appropriate circumstances.

3 DISCUSSION

Outside Bodies

- 3.1 The bodies that are subject to officer appointment and proposed appointees are set out at Appendix 1 for endorsement. For a number of bodies it would be appropriate to recommend that the Chairman of a specific Committee (Vice-Chairman to substitute) should be the appointee. This includes subsidiary bodies recently established by the Thames Gateway South Essex Board. The bodies for which this is the case are also set out at Appendix 1.
- 3.2 Set out at Appendix 2 is a list of those bodies requiring Member nominations for the next year, along with information on the timing, frequency and location of meetings.
- 3.3 Each Group Leader and non-Group Member has been asked to provide a list of nominees to serve on outside bodies with the aim, wherever possible, of these corresponding with nominees proposed for membership of the appropriate Policy Committee. Details of nominations will follow.

- 3.4 For the East of England Regional Assembly appointment, the Authority has been asked to have regard to the following guidance:-
 - Wherever possible, a representative should be a Senior Member of the Council.
 - Where a Council is in the control of a single recognised group, the representative of that Council should normally be a member of that controlling group.
 - All representatives should endeavour to take a whole region, strategic perspective in their role. They will be required to be bound by the Assembly's Code of Conduct and to declare any appropriate interests at meetings.
- 3.5 In view of the above parameters, the Leader of the Conservative Group has been asked to nominate to the Assembly.
- 3.6 With regard to the Essex Heritage Trust, it may be considered appropriate for the appointee to be the Champion for the Historic Environment.
- 3.7 In appointing to Outside Bodies there is no legal requirement to take account of the number of seats each political group holds on the Council as a whole. Should the pro rata rules be applied, the allocation of places for the seats identified at Appendix 2 would be as follows: -

Conservative 35
Liberal Democrat 4
Rochford District Residents 1

3.8 Attached for information at Appendix 3 is a guide produced by the Head of Legal Services relating to Members responsibilities and liabilities when representing the Authority on an Outside Body.

Area Forum/Local Strategic Partnership/Thames Gateway South Essex Board/Fourth Option Special Interest Group

3.9 The Leader of the Council (or their nominee) attends meetings of the County Council's South Essex Area Forum, the Rochford Local Strategic Partnership, the Thames Gateway South Essex Board and the Fourth Option Special Interest Group. It would be appropriate for Council to continue to endorse this aspect of the Leader's activity.

Joint Transfer Steering Group/Rochford Housing Association Shadow Board

Joint Transfer Steering Group

3.10 The Joint Transfer Steering Group originally set up to oversee the implementation of the Council's pre-ballot project plan for transfer of the Council's housing stock to a registered social landlord is expected to continue to meet during the 2006/07 Municipal Year.

3.11 Four nominations are required for this Group, which generally meets at the Freight House, Rochford during late afternoon/early evening on a monthly basis. The appointees to the Group cannot also serve on the Rochford Housing Association Shadow Board (see below). Substitutes can be appointed, although this has not been the practice to date.

Rochford Housing Association Shadow Board

- 3.12 As the ballot of tenants in connection with housing stock transfer nears, a Shadow Board is being established for the new Rochford Housing Association.
- 3.13 Four nominations are required for the Shadow Board, meetings of which are likely to be in the evenings on a monthly basis at a location within the District to be determined. Substitutes cannot be appointed and appointees cannot also serve on the Joint Transfer Steering Group (see above). It is likely that the Shadow Board will appoint sub-groups from the main Board membership.
- 3.14 The Council's housing stock transfer legal consultant has identified factors that should inform nominations to the Shadow Board, which include:-
 - Those appointed to the Shadow Board should be prepared to remain as Members for around two years.
 - The Housing Corporation will wish to see as much continuity as possible, particularly with regard to those who have played a key role in the option appraisal and transfer process.
 - As detailed negotiations will take place between the Council and the Rochford Housing Association, Members should be mindful of the potential for conflicts of interest to arise, particularly for the Leader of the Council, the Chairman of the Council and Chairmen of Committees.
 - The Council does not have to nominate Council Members as its representatives, but care needs to be taken with nominations as those disqualified from holding company directorship cannot be a Board member.
 - If Members are nominated, it is good practice to have a mix of political persuasions.

4 LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

5 RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

5.1 Members who attend outside body meetings are entitled to claim travel and subsistence allowances. Members should, however, only make these claims where there has been no support from the outside body concerned towards travel and subsistence.

6 RECOMMENDATION

6.1 It is proposed that the Council **RESOLVES**

- (1) The appointment of officers and Committee Chairmen (Vice-Chairmen to substitute) to outside bodies for the 2006/07 Municipal Year on the basis set out at Appendix 1 of this report.
- (2) The Member representatives (including substitutes) to be appointed for the 2006/07 Municipal Year to the outside bodies set out at Appendix 2 of this report.
- (3) To endorse the attendance of the Leader of the Council (or their nominee) as the Council's representative at meetings of the County Council's South Essex Forum, the Rochford Local Strategic Partnership, the Thames Gateway South Essex Board and the Fourth Option Special Interest Group. (HAMS)
- (4) The appointment of four representatives to the Joint Transfer Steering Group and four representatives to the Rochford Housing Association Shadow Board.
