Contained within this is a set of aspirational minimum levels of service across the county, which are based on the population of the Parish. Under this strategy the minimum level of service for Stambridge is 2 return journeys a day, 6 days per week plus one peak hour timed journey. The figure for Service 60 is currently £1.67. In considering whether additional services should be provided, the County Council will take a number of factors into consideration. These include the likely demand for the service, the availability of existing services, the availability of funding and whether the new service will meet the value for money measure. For the County Council to consider the request further it would need to know at what times residents would like any additional journeys and details of the potential usage. This would allow the County Council to speak to operators and to formulate a view as to whether the various factors would be met.
