IEG 2002 STATEMENT

1 SUMMARY

1.1 This report contains the Implementing Electronic Government (IEG) 2002 statement for comment and approval, prior to submission to the Office of the Deputy Prime Minister (ODPM) by 31 October 2002.

2 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 The Council's IS/ICT strategy 2001/02 to 2005/06 was considered at Council on 24 April 2001. Section 5 of the strategy was submitted to the then Department of Transport Local Government and the Regions as the Council's first IEG Statement in May 2002.
- 2.2 The IEG Statement was assessed by the Government as being satisfactory, subject to a need for greater detail on the implementation of the strategy and information about participation in national projects.
- 2.3 As a result of the satisfactory assessment, a £200,000 capital grant for e-government projects was received for 2002/03.

3 DETAILED CONSIDERATIONS

- 3.1 For 2003/04, the Government has made a grant of £200,000 available to all local authorities for e-government projects. This grant is subject to the submission of an IEG Statement for 2002, which has to provide evidence of taking e-government projects forward in the organisation, including an explanation of how the 2002/03 grant was spent and how the 2003/04 allocation will be utilised.
- 3.2 The Government has issued detailed guidance about the information required, and the draft Statement attached follows this guidance, and the good practice pro-forma issued by the Society of Information Technology Management (SOCITM).
- 3.3 The deadline for submission of the Statement is 31 October 2002.
- 3.4 From information obtained at briefings provided by the Government, it is apparent that the IEG Statement will form a key element of the Comprehensive Performance Assessment.

4 RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

4.1 Submission of an IEG Statement classed as satisfactory will result in the authority receiving a capital grant of £200,000 for e-government projects.
