SUMMER HOLIDAY ACTIVITIES

1 SUMMARY

1.1 The purpose of this report is to apprise Members of this year's summer holiday programme.

2 INTRODUCTION

2.1 A wide range of activities was on offer for children and young people. More minority sports or more unusual activities were on offer, helping to increase interest in the programme. Activities in Hullbridge, Canewdon, Great Wakering and Rayleigh were provided in association with the Parish and Town Councils who all contributed towards the overall cost. Hullbridge Parish Council contributed £720, Canewdon Parish Council £65, Great Wakering Parish Council £100 and Rayleigh Town Council £800. A grant of £150 was also received from the Essex County Lawn Tennis Association towards the cost of providing the short tennis at Great Wakering.

3 SWIMMING

- 3.1 This was the fourth year the swimming scheme operated. Five schools were involved and for the second year, Doggetts Primary School was offered free of charge. One afternoon session at Rayleigh Primary School had to be cancelled due to pool plant problems.
- 3.2 All of the venues proved popular with an overall increase of 120 attendances on last year. When the scheme was first introduced in 1999 there was a total of 1,434 attendances and this has grown to 3,458 attendances.

4. DAY CAMPS

4.1 The summer day camps were provided by Holmes Place on behalf of the Council. Out of a possible 2,000 attendances, there was a take-up of 1,866. The sessions held at Grange Community Centre this year were far more popular than in previous years with nearly every session fully booked. This may be attributed to the closure of Park Sports Centre.

5 SPORTS DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES

- 5.1 This year, there was a diverse range of activities on offer that offered a departure from the more run of the mill sports such as football and rugby. Activities such as ice skating, circus skills and skateboarding added to the excitement of the activity programme.
- 5.2 The success this year was overwhelming with 1,035 attendances compared to 490 last year.

6 ARTS DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES

- 6.1 Although the Arts Development Officer had only been in post a short time, workshops were arranged for Rayleigh and Hockley Libraries. Professional artists worked with those participating, following the theme "Our Reading World" which was the subject of the libraries' Big Read this year.
- 6.2 The workshops were held on Saturdays and attracted whole families, catering for a total of 115 attendances.
- 6.3 The Arts Development Officer also contributed to the success of the skateboarding and BMX day that was held in the Market Car Park in Rayleigh by organising a "spray can art" event.

7 CUSTOMER FEEDBACK

7.1 In line with best value, customer feedback questionnaires were issued and a total of 125 were returned. For information, the comments made are appended.

7 CRIME AND DISORDER IMPLICATIONS

7.1 The provision of sport and leisure activities for young people contributes towards the reduction of youth crime and youth nuisance.

8 PARISH IMPLICATIONS

8.1 Canewdon, Great Wakering and Hullbridge Parish Councils and Rayleigh Town Council were partners in the delivery of some of these activities.

9 **RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS**

- 9.1 The swimming programme cost £10,838 this year to deliver, which was well within the allocated budget of £12,000. As there is no guarantee that the Council will be given free use of Doggetts School pool in future years, it is requested that if Members decide to continue with this initiative, that the budget remains at £12,000.
- 9.2 The day camps run by Holmes Place cost £8,860 to run this year and there was £8,600 allocated in the budget. The cost increased due to more venues charging for their use and for the requirement now to pay casual staff holiday pay. If Members decide to continue with this initiative next year, the budget would need to be increased to £9,100.

10 **RECOMMENDATION**

It is proposed that the Committee **RESOLVES**

- (1) That Members note the success of the scheme this year.
- (2) That the swimming initiative continues and that a budget of £12,000 is included in the draft budget for 2003.
- (3) That the Day Camps continue and that a budget of £9,100 is included in the draft budget for 2003. (CD(F&ES))

The senior coach and RDC staff were confident that the staff to children ratios were adequate. All staff have mobile 'phones and have emergency contact numbers for the office and for the parents/guardians of those children taking part. No significant hazzards were identified in the risk assessment produced by the coach.
