REPORT FROM HEAD OF FINANCE, AUDIT AND PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT

SUBJECT: CAPITAL PROGRAMME - MONITORING REPORT FOR QUARTER 1 OF 2009-10

1 DECISION BEING RECOMMENDED

1.1 That the update on the progress in completing the General Fund Capital Programme for 2009/10, which is shown in the appendix to this report, be received.

2 REASON/S FOR RECOMMENDATION

2.1 To enable the Executive to raise any queries on progress in implementing the current Capital Programme. Expenditure is monitored on a monthly basis by the Financial Programmes Group, a multidisciplinary officer group.

3 OTHER SALIENT INFORMATION

- 3.1 The Revised Capital Programme for 2008/09 was agreed by Council on 30 June 2009, in the light of updated information following the closure of the accounts for 2008/09. The Total Capital Programme is £1.9m for 2009/10.
- 3.2 Where budgets were under spent in 2008/09 but still required, these were carried forward into the 2009/10 allocations and form part of the Revised Provision as seen in the Appendix to this report.
- 3.3 The majority of the capital provision in 2009/10 is for three projects: the purchase of the new bins for the Waste Contract (£122,500), the Hall Road Cemetery Extension (£248,841) and Cherry Orchard Jubilee Country Park (£100,200).
- 3.4 This is the first quarter report and the detail progress of the Capital Programme at the end of June 2009 is shown in the Appendix attached to this report.
- 3.5 The Capital Programme has historically been funded by capital receipts from the sale of council housing. Since the transfer of our housing stock, we are less able to predict the income that we will receive. Rochford Housing Association now deals with all Right to Buys (RTB) and we are entitled to an element of the proceeds dependant on the timing of the sale. This income is payable annually, therefore any sales in 2009/10 will not be received until 2010/11.

4 **RISK IMPLICATIONS**

4.1 Delays in completing the items on the Capital Programme could prevent the Council from achieving its strategic objectives and lead to adverse publicity for the Council. The allocation of resources is, therefore, carefully managed to ensure that the Programme is properly funded and the revenue consequences are included in the Medium Term Financial Strategy for the General Fund.

5 **RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS**

5.1 In the current economic climate, house prices are decreasing. For the RTB market this may lead to an increase in the number of properties sold. However, this is dependent on reductions in interest rates being passed to mortgage applicants, the availability of mortgages, and also the effect of the job market and other financial pressures on the tenants. If the latter points still remain an issue, then this could mean a dip in receipts.

I confirm that the above recommendation does not depart from Council policy and that appropriate consideration has been given to any budgetary and legal implications.
