PLAYSPACE ROLLING PROGRAMME 2001/02

1 SUMMARY

- 1.1 This report informs Members of the progress of the current Playspace Rolling Programme for 2000/01 delayed due to the inclement weather, and seeks approval for the next phase of the programme for 2001/02.
- 1.2 Appendix A shows the original Priority listing of all the playspaces and of the progress of the programme to date.

2 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 The 2000/01 Playspace Rolling programme was approved at Community Services on 10 October 2000 following a lengthy period of Public Consultation on the programme.
- 2.2 The 2001/02 programme will continue to work through the original priority list of playspaces as originally agreed by Members, but it is now considered appropriate to include skateboarding facilities in Canewdon following the public consultation.

3 2000/01 Programme

- 3.1 The 2000/01 Rolling programme consisted of the refurbishment of Elsenham Court, Rayleigh, and refurbishment of Rowan Way, Canewdon.
- 3.2 The programmes for these schemes were combined with those at Glebe Close and Morrins Close, Great Wakering to seek better value for money in the tender process.
- 3.3 As a result of the inclement weather during the latter half of 2000/01 the actual works to these playspaces were held until March 2001 when ground conditions at Glebe Close and Morrins Way had improved sufficiently to allow the ground works to commence. The works will be completed by the end of June 2001.

4 2001/02 Programme

4.1 As part of the consultation exercise carried out jointly with Canewdon Parish Council it became evident that Rowan Way should be refurbished only as a minor infant playspace due to its location, but that additionally there was a major need for Skateboarding facilities in Canewdon.

- 4.2 Further consultation has been undertaken jointly with Canewdon Parish Council to identify the level of need and the location for a new facility, and whether it was supported by residents in Canewdon. The result of this consultation has been positive in support of skateboarding facilities and that a new skateboarding facility would be appropriate on the Althorne Way Recreation ground. Appendix B summarises the results of the consultation.
- 4.3 The consultation also included the provision of a "Teen Shelter", the result of which is much closer, 52% in support, and 48% against. It is not clear therefore whether this can be recommended.
- 4.4 A further consultation with the Parish Council will need to be carried out to ensure that the optimum location on Althorne Way recreation ground is established.
- 4.5 Fyfield Path in Rayleigh has been removed from the programme in previous years due to a number of ongoing Crime and Disorder issues affecting the area that have been difficult to resolve. However there have been no reports of problems at this site over the last year, and it is understood that a number of parents have made serious efforts to reclaim this playspace for the children for which it is intended. The playspace is in need of refurbishment and can now be considered as a suitable case for inclusion in the programme. Fyfield Path was priority 2 on the original list.

5 CRIME AND DISORDER IMPLICATIONS

5.1 The provision of playspaces and play equipment contributes to the reduction of youth nuisance.

6 ENVIRONMENTAL IMPLICATIONS

6.1 Refurbished playspaces will generally improve the environment of the area in which they are located.

7 RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

7.1 An allocation of £50k is included in the 2001/02 Capital Programme for these works.

8 PARISH IMPLICATIONS

8.1 All playscheme proposals will be carried out in Consultation with the Parish / Town Council affected.

9 RECOMMENDATION

- 9.1 It is proposed that the Committee **RESOLVES**
 - (1) To agree the installation of a skateboarding facility at Canewdon following agreement with Canewdon Parish Council of the actual location within Althorne Way Recreation Ground.
 - (2) To agree the refurbishment of Fyfield Path playspace
