Mandatory Conditions

Supply of alcohol (section 19)

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence –
 - a. at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises, or
 - b. at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Exhibition of films (section 20)

1. Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films the licence must include a condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with this section.
2. Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection (3)(b) below applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.
3. Where –
 - a. the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or
 - b. the licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question,
 admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by the licensing authority.
4. In this section –

“Children” means person aged under 18; and

“Film classification body” means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984.

Door supervision (section 21)

1. Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, the licence must include a condition that each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Embedded Restrictions

The following are embedded restrictions from the previous licence/certificate:

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

In this condition, permitted hours means

- a) On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, Good Friday or New Year’s Eve, 11.00 to 23.00hrs
- b) On Sundays, other than Christmas Day or New year’s Eve, 12.00 to 22.30hrs.
- c) On Good Friday, 12.00 to 22.30hrs
- d) On Christmas Day, 12.00 to 15.00hrs and 19.00 to 22.30hrs
- e) On New Year’s Eve, except on a Sunday, 11.00 to 23.00hrs
- f) On New Year’s Eve on a Sunday, 12.00 to 22.30hrs
- g) On New Year’s Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year’s Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- b) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
- c) consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- d) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;

- e) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purpose of the trade or club;
- f) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- g) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- h) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purpose of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.

No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:

1. He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
2. He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
3. He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
4. The Bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxication liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.

Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority
