The consultants presented their findings to the Committee on 18th March 2003 (Minute 134/03). A sub-committee has been set up to examine the implications of the consultant's findings and to propose a way forward. Any further examination of footway improvements to await the outcome of the sub-committee's discussions.</p>
